### **Updates from Vietnam**

### **Indigenous Banana Planting Project Thrives**

The Indigenous Banana Planting Project supports 10 ethnic minority households in Ta Lao village, Đakrông district. It includes training, fertilizers, and seedlings for banana farming, with support from PeaceTrees Vietnam for land clearance and safety. The first 1,000 seedlings were planted in 2022 and we are elated to share that number has grown to 2,700 banana trees! First harvests have also taken place and the first bananas have been sold at market, helping local communities to improve their livelihoods. A pilot program to provide piglets to

complement the banana project efforts will be moving forward in the near future (baby piglet photos soon to follow!).

#### **Revolving Goat Project Advances**

PeaceTrees' goat husbandry project established in 2022 in Vietnam's Hương Hóa district, benefits 30 ethnic minority households across three communes. It was created in response to the 2020 floods and landslides, aiming to enhance livelihoods by teaching goat raising. As of July 2022, 53 baby goats have been born into the project and an additional 8 adult goats have been brought into the herd. Participating households continue to improve and refine livestock husbandry techniques, which provide knowledge, skills, and sustainable income opportunities.
